Your Martyr, O Lord, in his courageous contest for You received as the prize, the crown of incorruption and life from You our immortal God. For since he possessed Your strength, he cast down the tyrants and wholly destroyed the demons' strengthless presumption. O Christ God, by his prayers, save our souls, since You art merciful. (SAM)

Apolytikion of St. George: 4th Tone (back of Green Hymmal)

As the deliverer of captives, and the protector of the poor; a physician of the sick, the defender of kings; O Great Martyr St. George Victorious, intercede to Christ our God, to save our souls.

Kontakion of Forefeast of Meeting of our Lord: 4th Tone (Feb 1)

On this day does Symeon receive with gladness God, the Giver of the Law; and he does cry to Him in fear: Let me depart now, O Master Christ, for I have seen You, the Glory of Israel. (SAM)
